

Peace Direct

Peace Direct is an organisation that supports local groups that are working for peace in countries where conflict is endemic. It supports projects in many African and Asian countries. It is so often the local people who have the understanding of the problem that makes effective work possible and a little financial help can make all the difference. Youth Alliance for Peace and Environment, Nepal

Peacebuilder: Borhaj Timilsina
Achievements: 14 violent conflicts resolved in 2010; freephone set up across Kavre District so Borhaj and his colleagues can be contacted whenever violence threatens.

Public desire for change

Nepal is struggling towards peace after ten years of civil war. Political riots and manipulation are still commonplace, and as people begin to rebuild their lives there is a need for adequate compensation and justice for the victims of conflict, so that calls for vengeance do not threaten a fragile future.

The government provides compensation to victims of conflict, but the complexity of the political situation means that often government officials will only process the claims of people who belong to their party - breeding further hate and anger. Local organization YAPE, run by peace builders Borhaj and Kishor, aims to counteract this by acting as a non-biased intermediary which can use its networks to apply pressure and ensure compensation is granted to those who deserve it.

In celebration of Nepalese New Year, Borhaj and Kishor organized a mass rally for peace in the centre of Kavre town. People flocked to the rally - men, women and children from all

sectors of society. It was a clear indication of the desire for change in society.

Following the rally, Borhaj and Kishor held an open meeting for conflict victims in their office to discuss how they might be able to help people secure compensation. Their office was filled with people and many more stood outside, craning to enter the room. By coming to YAPE these people who been through so much are engaging in peaceful dialogue instead of returning to violence.

In 2010 Borhaj and his colleagues resolved 14 violent conflicts ranging from street riots to attacks on school. This year they have set up a hotline for peace - a free phone line that means they can be contacted at any time.

Centre Resolution Conflicts

Achievements: 14,000 displaced people accompanied home; 1,020 rebel soldiers disarmed and integrated; 650 child soldiers rescued; 364 local conflicts resolved.

Congolese Government brings halt to cash-for-weapons programme

Disarming rebel soldiers and stopping them from returning to war is one of the biggest challenges facing Congo today.

When Paluku was 20, war came to his village. Unable to sit and watch, Paluku joined the Mai Mai - an armed group set up to protect the lives of villagers. As the war escalated in Congo, and resources became scarcer, the Mai Mai became more embroiled in the fighting.

War has ravaged Congo since 1996. Many of the men do not know why they are fighting, but they simply do not know how else to survive.

In Paluku's regiment there were 1,000 men and over 500 children. Renowned for his battle skills for 14 years Paluku taught the men how to fight tooth and nail for territory - irrespective of the women and children caught in the crossfire.

There are many organisations working to disarm fighters in Congo - many offer a cash-for-weapons incentive. But the money offered to hand over weapons is often more than the market value of the weapon, and these programmes have been accused of increasing rather than reducing the number of weapons. The Congolese Government has recently stated that these programmes will no longer operate.

Local peacebuilder Henri Ladyi's programmes do not work on this basis. Instead former rebel soldiers living in peace are mobilised to reach out to their former colleagues. The soldiers who then join Henri's programmes do so because they have a genuine desire to lay down their arms.

The move by the Congolese government is encouraging. It shows an awareness of the faults of quick-win solutions. In 2010 Henri assisted 1020 rebel soldiers to lay down their arms. He did this at a cost of under \$200 per combatant. This is a fraction of the \$5.5 million budget that the UN in Congo allocated to their demobilisation Programme.

Paluku and 180 other men came to seek Henri's assistance. Paluku received clothes, water, an ID card and training to help him live in peace. Today Paluku oversees a co-operative of 440 former militia set up by Henri. Together they pool their resources for farming and animal husbandry.
