

CND AGM & Policy Conference- 15 October 2017

CND held its annual AGM and Policy Conference again in London this year. Not a particularly exciting event, but, given that its purpose is for members to elect Council representatives and establish CND policies and priorities for the coming year, that's as it should be. However, it was a thoroughly business - like and positive occasion and one, perhaps imbued with more optimism than usual.

The tenor of the Conference was set by both positive and negative factors.

On the positive, the awarding of the Nobel Peace Prize to the International Campaign for the Abolition of Nuclear Weapons (ICAN) and the UN's nuclear weapons ban treaty.

On the negative, the escalating nuclear tension between the US and North Korea, NATO's continuing expansionist and provocative policies, President Trump's apparent eagerness to increase America's nuclear arsenal and his threat to wreck the Iran non-proliferation treaty.

That was the context within which delegates, in democratic debate, established the following priorities for CND in 2018.

Campaigning to secure UK signature to the UN's Global Nuclear Weapons Ban Treaty -

122 Nations voted through an unprecedented Weapons Ban Treaty at the UN in July this year and it is now open for ratification by member states. The nine nuclear armed states, including the US and the UK have ignored or denigrated the Treaty, so CND's campaigning focus will be to change our government's mind and get them to sign up to this potentially world changing initiative.

Campaigning to make scrapping our Trident Nuclear Weapons system a major factor in the next General Election –

given the very real possibility of another General Election in 2018, CND members of all political parties to ensure that Trident is a prominent issue in any campaign and to seek to persuade candidates to oppose Trident replacement.

Raising awareness of US and NATO military bases in the UK

and exposing their continuing role in nuclear weapons research, production and storage and in facilitating NATO's dangerous, de-stabilising and expansionist policies in Europe. CND to work with international groups and with local groups in actions at UK bases such as Fylingdales, Menwith Hill and Croughton.

Campaigning at both national and international level, to persuade governments to abandon the outdated concept of nuclear deterrence in favour of the UN's common security approach.

The notion of deterrence is based on mutual fear and suspicion and underwrites the drive for overwhelming military dominance which produces nuclear proliferation. States must recognise their interdependence in the face of modern threats of climate change, pandemics and terrorism. CND to promote the concept that Nations hold security in common and must work together to counter these common threats.

Campaigning to build international opposition to NATO –

alerting public opinion to its role as a destabilising expansionist nuclear armed alliance and the dangers posed by its confrontational rhetoric and military exercises throughout Europe.

There was also an emergency resolution strongly condemning both North Korea's nuclear and missile testing and US nuclear intimidation and provocative military exercises, both in disregard of UN Security Council resolutions. CND to urgently campaign for the UK Government to explicitly reject a military solution to the Korean conflict and support the UN's call for a resumption of the Six Party Talks. This was passed unanimously.

New Global Ban Treaty is a game changer in the UK nuclear disarmament debate

On 20th September 2017 the new UN Treaty on the Prohibition of Nuclear Weapons opened for signatories from member states. It replicates the global agreements in recent years to ban weapons of mass destruction such as chemical and biological weapons, as well as landmines. The time has come to ban nuclear weapons too, and the new treaty would prohibit the use, stockpiling, testing, production, manufacture, stationing and installation of nuclear weapons, and it commits signatories to assisting victims of nuclear weapons, whether from their testing or their

Once 50 countries have signed the Treaty, it comes into force; signatories have signed up to encouraging other states to join and there will be regular review meetings on progress towards achieving a global ban.

When the text was agreed by 122 nation states in July 2017 it was the culmination of years of work by nonnuclear states and civil society,

reflecting the frustration of the global majority with the failure of the small number of nuclear weapon states, such as Britain, to honour their commitments under the Non-Proliferation Treaty to pursue in good faith steps towards an end to the nuclear arms race and for nuclear disarmament. Britain must now decide if it will remain in splendid isolation on this issue, or recognise the multilateral momentum developing towards a global ban across the planet. At last year's annual conference Labour committed to playing a leading role in global nuclear disarmament, but under the Tories Britain has been on the sidelines as the International agenda has developed rapidly. Labour must call on the British Government to sign the treaty at an early stage and renew its commitment to be a world leader under a Labour government.

With Jeremy Corbyn as Prime Minister that commitment will be taken seriously internationally and the next Labour Government's place in history would be its part in bringing a nuclear free world.

Labour CND

Recalls the 2017 manifesto commitments to:

- 'reducing human suffering caused by war
- 'lead multilateral efforts with international partners and the UN to create a nuclear free world'
- Creating 'a Minister for Peace and Disarmament to lead this work.

Believes that support for the Treaty is in line with these commitments and: 'Therefore calls on the next Labour Government to ratify the Treaty on the Prohibition of Nuclear Weapons.

Labour CND

Labour CND are planning to hold their annual conference and AGM in Yorkshire in February. This is to coincide with the launch of Yorkshire Labour CND. They suggest that Merseyside and G. Manchester CND members who are also Labour Party members might attend with a view to setting up Labour CND groups in their areas.

Wallasey and Birkenhead CND are trying to set up either one meeting with all Labour Party constituencies or individual meetings with each of the 4 Labour Wirral constituencies.

Only one of the Wirral MPs (Margaret Greenwood MP for Wirral West) supports us.

Rest of Merseyside

There are 18 more constituencies in Merseyside—17 Labour and 1 Tory— we need to get to their constituency meetings and get them to discuss the new Global Ban and hopefully put pressure on their MPs to vote against Trident, and for signing the Global Ban Treaty. After all if the Global Ban is going to come in within the next couple of years—why are we spending any more money on Trident now???

Don't Bank on the Bomb!

Now that the Treaty to Ban Nuclear Weapons is confirmed—we now have to get rid of them. One way is to stop investment in them

Hence the idea of 'Don't Bank on the Bomb'

Financial institutions around the world invest 314 billion dollars in nuclear weapons producers. 298 banks, pension funds and insurance companies invest in 27 companies involved in the production, maintenance and modernisation of nuclear weapons.

The 'Don't bank on the Bomb' website www.dontbankonthebomb.org lists institutions in two categories — Hall of Fame and Hall of Shame.

The Cooperative Bank is the only major bank in UK in the 1st category. Those in the Hall of Fame are examples of Good practice. There is also a category which has partial limiting or exclusion policies towards investment. Barclays and Royal Bank of Scotland fall into this category but need to widen their exclusion policies.

"Just one letter has an effect, said Suzi Snyder, founder of Don't Bank on the Bomb. One year one person wrote to her bank, asking for their policy statement on their investments, nothing much happened, then they got another letter, so they brought out the first letter, and began to do something. Banks want to project a nice caring image; Nuclear Weapons do not do that."

'Don't Bank on the Bomb' is in the tradition of the boycott of South African goods that brought down Apartheid. It will raise the issue of nuclear Weapons in our local communities, as well as pushing our financial institutions towards disinvestment. We can write our letters privately, we can write them together, we can stand outside those financial institutions that invest in Nuclear Weapon production.

Merseyside Peace Network

Merseyside Peace Network is a coalition of peace related groups such as CND, Quakers, Pax Christi, Forces Watch who meet regularly to plan campaigning together.

Their current concerns include:-Creeping militarisation particularly in schools but also on our streets in the form of 'fun days' such as 'Armed Forces Day' when children are invited to play with guns and climb on tanks. The Irish Guards promoted themselves in Williamson Square with a gazebo structure sheltering a military vehicle, a tripod-mounted heavy machine gun and a climbing frame!! John Usher of Pax Christi says: "Most of us believe in tolerance, mutual respect and nonviolent coexistence between nations which is what we should be promoting. Our Armed Forces must be for defense only, and never for aggression as in recent years in the Middle East. I've just watched the film 'Journey's End' about life and pointless death in thetrenches in the First World War, a onderful film and utterly depressing. War must never be glorified or celebrated or even normalised. War indicates failure, in war all sides are losers. We must work for justice, because justice results in peace."


